




About the Texas PMP

The Texas Prescription Monitoring Program (Texas PMP), managed by the Texas State Board of Pharmacy, collects and monitors outpatient prescription data for all Schedule II, III, IV and V controlled substances dispensed by a pharmacy in Texas or to a Texas resident from a pharmacy located in another state.

The Texas PMP is a patient care tool that can be used to inform prescribing practices, as well as address prescription drug misuse and diversion. The Texas PMP shares prescription data with 36 other states and entities, allowing prescribers and pharmacists to track prescriptions dispensed outside the state of Texas.







2015

- In 2015, the 84th Texas Legislature voted to transfer the PMP from DPS to the Texas State Board of Pharmacy.
- Senate Bill 195 moved the Prescription Monitoring Program from the Department of Public Safety (DPS) to the Board of Pharmacy; and
- Eliminated the Texas Controlled Substance Registration program.




*Per CDC guidance, the MME conversion factors prescribed or provided as part of the medication-assisted treatment for opioid use disorder should not be used to benchmark against dosage thresholds meant for opioids prescribed for pain. Buprenorphine products have no agreed upon morphine equivalency, and as partial opioid agonists, are not expected to be associated with overdose risk in the same dose-dependent manner as doses for full agonist opioids. MME = morphine milligram equivalents. LME = Lorazepam milligram equivalents. mg = dose in milligrams.

I understand that inappropriate access or disclosure of PMP information is a violation of federal and state law, and may result in disciplinary action, revocation of PMP database access, civil penalties, and/or criminal action. I understand the PMP administrator will conduct auditing activities to monitor for unusual or potentially unauthorized use of the system. The information in the PMP database and reports generated from the information may contain errors resulting from the information submitted by dispensers. The Texas State Board of Pharmacy recommends independent verification of the patient prescription information with pharmacies and prescribers when prudent or necessary. The data available from other state Prescription Monitoring Programs is based on the data submitted by the dispensers in the specific state in accordance with their state's reporting requirements.




Using a Delegate to Access the Texas PMP

- The Texas PMP allows prescribers and pharmacists to designate an unlimited number of delegates to access patient prescription data and generate reports on their behalf.
 Eligible prescriber delegates include nurses, medical residents, administrative staff, etc.
- The use of delegates saves time for prescribers and pharmacists. It also can be helpful in integrating use of the Texas PMP into workflows.

Mandated Use of the Texas PMP

Effective March 1, 2020

Prescribers and pharmacists will be required by Texas state law to use the Texas PMP to review a patient's prescription history before prescribing or dispensing opioids, benzodiazepines, barbiturates, or carisoprodol.

HB2847 PMP Access

Under the Controlled Substances Act

- Amends Section 481.076(a)(5)(A) of the Texas Controlled Substances
 Act to allow a pharmacist-intern or a pharmacy technician trainee to
 access the PMP database when appropriate.
- Similarly amends Section 481.076(a)(6) to allow a practitioner to access the PMP database to inquire about the prescribing activity of an individual to whom the practitioner has delegated prescribing authority, i.e., a nurse practitioner, physician assistant, etc.

HB3284 Accessing the PMP

Under the Controlled Substances Act

 The bill allows a patient, a minor patient's parent, or a patient's legal guardian to request that patient's PMP record and a record of the practitioners and pharmacists that have accessed the record. Patient Access Program online Effective June 1, 2020



- The bill requires the Board to adopt an administrative penalty for unauthorized disclosure or use of PMP information.
- The bill creates criminal offenses related to unauthorized disclosure of PMP information, misrepresentation in requesting a patient's PMP record, and procurement of controlled substances through the use of fraudulent prescription forms.

HB3285 Continuing Education

Under the Controlled Substances Act

Requires prescribers or dispensers of opioids to annually attend at least one hour of continuing education covering best practices, alternative treatment options, and multi-modal approaches to pain management which may include physical therapy, psychotherapy, and other treatments.

This requirement expires August 31, 2023.






